Anne Averill, PhD, of UMass-Amherst, will be speaking on her research on the health of native bees.

Joe Kovalski - Joe has been keeping bees for 19 years. This all started out as a Boy Scout Beekeeping Merit Badge project with his younger son and two hives. Joe teaches beekeeping to boy scouts, girl scouts and 4H. He also does presentations for schools, garden clubs, and other beekeeping organizations.

Joe is an EAS Master Beekeeper, West Virginia Master Beekeeper, Certified Ohio State Beekeeper, EAS director for Ohio, and Ohio State 2008 Beekeeper of the Year.

Joe, along with his wife Suzan, produce beeswax candles and honey for sale at many fairs and festivals, and have won many best of show and blue ribbons in honey and molded wax contests. Joe is currently the Crossroads Region director for the Ohio State Beekeepers Assoc. Joe is part of the new Ohio Queen Initiative, and also a member of the West Virginia Queen Producers Assoc., raising queens in the northern panhandle.

Bill Mares, 2012 EAS President, will tell us about the August EAS conference in Burlington, Vermont.
