Jamie Ellis has a bachelor’s degree in biology from the University of Georgia (UGA). In 2004, Jamie was awarded his PhD in Entomology from Rhodes University in Grahamstown, South Africa. In 2006, Jamie joined the Entomology and Nematology faculty at the University of Florida (UF) as an Assistant Professor. Jamie has responsibilities in extension, instruction and re-search. Jamie created the AFBEE program (African Bee Extension and [Education Program](#)), the UF Bee College, and the UF Master Beekeeper Program. As an instructor, Jamie currently supervises 1 PhD and 1 masters student in addition to offering an online beekeeping course. Currently, Jamie conducts research on honey bee husbandry and ecology, pesticide impacts on honey bees, African honey bees, and native pollinator ecology and conservation. Jamie is also a bivocational youth minister at Mt. Pleasant Baptist Church in High Springs, FL. Jamie and his wife Amanda are the parents of Mathias, Analy, and Jude Ellis.

Dr. James E. Tew is currently the Beekeeping Specialist for the Alabama Cooperative Extension System, Auburn University. Before retiring in 2011, Dr. Tew served as the State Extension Beekeeping Specialist at The Ohio State University for 34 years. Since 1975 Jim has taught [classes](#), provided extension services, and conducted applied research on honey bees and honey bee behavior - specifically pollination behavior. Additionally, he continues to contribute monthly articles for national beekeeping publications and has written: *Beekeeping Principles* and *Backyard Beekeeping*. He is a frequent speaker at state and national meetings and has traveled extensively to observe beekeeping techniques. Jim has five grand kids who keep him spry and active. For enjoyment, he wood works, photographs, and feeds ungrateful birds.
