"Show Us The Asali Pesa [*honey money*]: Adventures On Nyuki [*bee*] Safari in Tanzania "

Mary Canning, proprietress of Follow The Honey in Harvard Square, shares anecdotes from her recent sojourn to Africa by invitation of Prime Minister Pinda of Tanzania, himself a beekeeper trained by local entrepreneur and apiarist David Camara; protecting wildlife, cultivating eco-tourism and developing integrative social enterprise through honey production.

Follow The Honey's social justice mission locally & globally is defending the price of honey and the bees cultivating this elixir with their stewards; raising awareness as to its hard won properties and value. Being in Harvard Square, they are situationally in the embrace of a vibrant eclectic hive mind who know we need to act locally, yet think planet-wise about bees.
